 - c. His right hand, arm and presence (3)

 - a. Boast in **God** all day long
 - b. Praise His name **forever**

 - a. **Cast** them off and put them to **shame** (9)
 - b. Made them **spoil** and **food** (10-11)
 - c. **Scattered** them among the nations (11)
 - d. **Sold** them for nothing (12)
- 2. What did they believe God had done to them regarding their neighbors? (13-14)
 - a. Made them a **reproach**, scorn and a derision (13)
 - b. Made them a byword, a **shaking** of the head (14)

You Have Made Us

- 3. Because of this, how does the individual feel? (15)
 - a. Dishonor and **shame** all day long
- 4. Why does the individual feel this way? (16)
 - a. The **voice** of those speaking against (neighbors)
 - b. The enemy and avenger

 - a. **Forgotten** God (17,20)
 - b. Dealt falsely in their **covenant** with God (17)
 - c. Had not turned away or to another **god** (18,20)
- 2. They were confident in saying this because they believed? (21)
 - a. God knew their **heart**

You Know

- 3. How did they currently feel?
 - a. Alone in the wilderness with **death** covering them (19)
 - b. Sheep for the **slaughter** (22)
- 4. Why do they feel this way?
 - a. God had done all of this to them (19)
 - b. Being **killed** for the God's **sake** (22)

Arise, O Lord

- 1. What do they want God to do?
 - a. Don't' cast them off **forever** (23)
 - b. **Help** them (26)
 - c. **Redeem** them (26)
- 2. What do they humbly want to know from God? (24-25)
 - a. **Why** He is doing this to them (cf Deut 31:16-18)

Applications

- 1. God has saved Christians, yet we groan (Rom 8:22-24)
- 2. God knows what I'm feeling and is doing something about it (Rom 8:26-30)
- 3. God has not cast Christians off forever just because bad is happening to us (Rom 8:31-39)
