INTRODUCTION

- Psalm of David
- A Psalm organized by the Hebrew alphabet
 - Except “Nun” (cf Ps 119:105-12)
- Note the bookends

BOOKENDS: FOREVER AND EVER

1. What will David do? (1-2,21)
 - a. **Bless** and praise **Your name** everyday forever and ever
2. What will all flesh do? (21)
 - a. **Bless His holy name** forever and ever

PSALM 145:4-9

1. What will others do?
 - a. One generation
 - i. Praise Your **works** to another generation (4)
 - ii. Declare Your **mighty acts** (4,6)
 - iii. Utter the memory of Your **great goodness** (7)
 - iv. Sing of Your **righteousness** (7)
2. What will David do?
 - a. **Meditate** on:
 - i. The glorious splendor of Your **majesty** (5)
 - ii. Your **wondrous works** (5)
 - b. Will declare Your **greatness** (6 cf 3)

PSALM 145:10-16

1. Who shall praise and bless You, O LORD? (10)
 - a. Your **works**
 - b. Your **saints**
2. What will they speak and talk about? (11)
 - a. The **glory** of Your **kingdom**
 - b. Your **power**
3. Who will they tell? (12)
 - a. The **sons of men**
4. What will they make known the sons of men? (13)
 - a. His **mighty acts**
 - b. The **glorious splendor** of His **kingdom**

PSALM 145:10-16


5. How is the LORD's kingdom and dominion described? (13)
 - a. It is an **everlasting** kingdom
 - b. His dominion is throughout all **generations**
6. What does the LORD do? What does that demonstrate? (14-16)
 - a. **Upholds** all who **fall** (14)
 - a. Strength
 - b. **Raises** those who are bowed **low** (15)
 - a. Restoration
 - c. Gives **food** and **satisfaction** (15-16)
 - a. Daily provision

PSALM 145:17-21

1. What is the relationship with the King? Who does He bless?
 - a. He is **near** to all who **call** upon Him in **truth** (18)
 - b. He will **fulfill the desire** of those who **fear Him** (19)
 - c. He will **hear** their cry and **save** them (19)
 - d. He **preserves** all those who **love Him** (20)

APPLICATIONS

1. What should I be telling others about the kingdom of God?
2. Go home and meditate for 5 minutes on the splendor of God
3. Praise & Bless God every day for ever and ever
