### Lesson 2: Psalm 32

#### Intro to Psalm 32

- It is inscribed as a Maskil
  - A Psalm that is written for the purpose of teaching. 13 Psalms are inscribed this way.
- It is most likely in reference to the sin of David with \_\_\_\_\_ (2 Samuel 11-12). It is probably written after Psalm 51.

  - d. Whose spirit has no \_\_\_\_\_ (2)
2. What was he like before? (3-4,10)
  - a. Bones growing old (3)
  - b. \_\_\_\_\_ all the day long (3)
    - i. Felt the \_\_\_\_\_ of the Lord on him day and night (4)
    - ii. Many \_\_\_\_\_ (10)
  - c. Life sucked out of him (4)
3. Why is he blessed? (5)
  - a. He acknowledged his sin to \_\_\_\_\_ (5)
  - b. He did not \_\_\_\_\_ his iniquity (5)
  - c. He \_\_\_\_\_ his transgressions to the Lord (5)
  - d. The Lord \_\_\_\_\_ him (5)

#### David's Advice (Psalm 32:6-11)

1. What should the godly do first? (6)
  - a. \_\_\_\_\_ to the Lord while He can be found
2. What can the godly expect from YHWH? (6-7, 10)
  - a. \_\_\_\_\_ (6-7)
  - b. \_\_\_\_\_ (7)
  - c. \_\_\_\_\_ (10)
3. How should one approach YHWH? (8-9)
  - a. Willingly unlike a stubborn \_\_\_\_\_ that must be forced (8-9)
